BUYING TICKETS

How to get tickets for the 2024 edition of Festivaletteratura. We ask you to read the following information carefully.

HOW TO BUY

Festivaletteratura tickets can only be purchased online AT WWW.FESTIVALETTERATURA.IT

from 9 a.m. on Wednesday 28 August → for filofestival members

from 9 a.m. on Friday 30 August → for everyone else

At the end of the purchasing procedure, you will receive **the PDF tickets by email**. These must be shown either printed or on your phone at the event venues (at a cost of £0.50 per order, tickets can be delivered on Whatsapp). Your automatically assigned seat number will be printed on the ticket (this does not include standing events, itineraries or installations). Some events, marked with numbers from 500 upwards, will be free of charge but with compulsory booking, and this must be made through the ticketing system. To book, simply add these events to your shopping cart and complete the transaction. Please note that non-members may purchase up to a maximum of 4 tickets per event.

Accepted payment methods: credit cards, Satispay, Amazon Pay, Paypal, Carta Giovani Cultura and Carta del Docente (the latter two only allow the purchase of one ticket per event).

To facilitate the purchasing process, from Thursday 22 August everyone will be able to pre-register on the ticketing platform at bit.ly/fl-login

RE-SALE

As of this year, you will be able to resell tickets that you do not wish to use. To do so, go to "My orders" on the ticketing platform. This is not an automatic refund however: if any other user is interested in the ticket now available and buys it, the cost of the ticket (i.e. excluding service fees) will be credited to the bank card used at the time of purchase. **Tickets can be put back on sale up to one hour before the start of the event.** There is a service **charge of \epsilon1.50 per ticket. N.B.:** Resale is not applicable for purchases made with Carta Giovani Cultura and Carta del Docente

HELP DESK

At the Loggia del Grano (via Spagnoli 4) volunteers will be on hand to help with online purchasing: from Wednesday 28 August to Tuesday 3 September → from 9:00 to 13:00 and from 15:00 to 19:00

(Sunday 1 September closed)

from Wednesday 4 to Saturday 7 September → from 9:00 to 19:00;

Sunday 8 September → from 9:00 to 17:00

From Wednesday 4 to Sunday 8 two more help desks will be set up at **Palazzo di San Sebastiano** and the **Infopoint in Piazza Sordello**. Opening hours will be the same as at the main help desk in the Loggia del Grano.

REFUNDS

In the event of cancellation of one or more events, a refund will be made automatically by re-crediting the net cost of the ticket.

ACCESSIBILITY

For the purchase of tickets for **people with disabilities**, please send an e-mail to <u>perilfestival@festivaletteratura.it</u>, by 25 August, subject to availability.

WORKSHOPS AND EVENTS FOR CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE

The events for children and young people are exclusively designed for an **audience of the age group indicated in the programme.** Accompanying adults will also be able to purchase tickets, except for events/workshops marked with an $\frac{2}{10}$. For events marked with an $\frac{2}{10}$, the presence of an adult is expressly required. There is no need to purchase an additional ticket.

REGULATIONS FOR FILOFESTIVAL MEMBERS

The deadline for signing up for the Filofestival (friends of the Festival) membership card is **19 August**. Members of the Filofestival Association can purchase tickets **from 9:00. on Wednesday 28 August**.

When purchasing online you will need to enter the 6-character alphanumeric number (printed on the card or received by e-mail).

The card is strictly personal.

Each individual member can book 1 ticket only per event for events that are compatible in terms of time (with a space of at least 60 minutes). The service will allow two members to purchase adjacent seats. To do so, all that is required is that one member purchases the two tickets at the reduced rate and enters the two membership card numbers during the purchasing process. The membership discount is 10% of the full ticket price.

As a self-defined "profound investigator of the human experience", the author of *Limonov, L'Adversaire*, and *D'autres vies que la mienne* often tells stories about everyday life and current events that can be filled with madness and horror. He looks at these events with a blend of clear insight and understanding. Whether discussing Russia, where his mother was born, or his native Paris, as in *V13*, Carrère reflects with the soul of an intellectual on dark and tragic moments, such as his grandfather's past as a Nazi or the 2015 Bataclan attack. He knows how unsettling it can be to talk or read about such topics. "But sharing felt like confronting a ghost. It was as if I had taken my deepest pain, wrapped it up, and then let it go. After that, I felt lighter." The author of *Le Détroit de Behring* will be having a conversation with literary critic Vincenzo Latronico.

In Paul Lynch's masterly prose, everything seems to plunge into the darkest abysses of human nature and our uncertain present. In novels such as *Red Sky in Morning, Grace* and *The Black Snow*, amidst ruthless manhunts, extravagant expedients to resist hunger and painful returns to the homeland, the Irish author has evoked the demons that haunt the memory of an entire nation. In his most recent *Prophet Song*, winner of the 2023 Booker Prize, Lynch brought into play, in a near future very close to our own, the destinies of women, men and families tenaciously clinging to life and the survival of their loved ones, even when a world built on civil liberties and rights falls under the weight of war and dictatorship. He will be talking to writer Olga Campofreda.



It began as a grassroots initiative during the run-up to the very first Festival in 1997, to help make a dream come true: the aim was to **organise a truly festive occasion** that would bring authors and their readers together and enable everyone to enjoy getting to know each other.

Goldie Goldbloom and Lella Costa

Walking through New York's Williamsburg neighbourhood, it is easy to come across members of the Hasidic community, recognisable all over the world by their ultra-Orthodox dress: long black jackets, wide-brimmed hats, the *payot*, or sidelocks, framing the men's faces, and the Yiddish expressions are only the most immediate aspects of a microcosm that rejects the secularised world. Goldie Goldbloom is an Australian-born author living in the United States, an activist for the rights of Lgbtqia+ people and Hasidism, who has explored the condition of women (*On Division*) within this very conservative community. Amidst prejudice, views of the female role, problems with pregnancy and the world of work, "love and freedom are always possible. Any society imposes rules and tries to tell us what to think, and why. [...] We struggle to connect to the people we love, with the fear of being judged." Goldie Goldbloom will be sharing the stage with actress and writer Lella Costa.

He focuses on the urgent issues we face today, where the environment is under threat of planteary combustion. Mbembe sets out to create a sense of unity among all people on Earth. In his discussion with anthropologist Lorenzo Alunni, he will highlight a crucial point: not just humans, but every animal, plant, and even non-living things are essential for developing a new understanding of our planet and moving towards the "liberation of all living things".

28 PICASSO THE EXILE

Annie Cohen-Solal with Niccolò Ammaniti and Michele Fusilli

When Picasso died in 1973, the French state welcomed his work with pomp and circumstance. assimilating it into its own history. But how many remember that the artist, when he first arrived in Paris in 1900, was constantly surveilled by the police? How many imagine the climate of suspicion he was subjected to throughout his life as a foreigner and avant-garde artist in a country obsessed with "national purity" and "good taste"? Writer Annie Cohen-Solal has dedicated her literary production to great artists who have faced exile and, thanks to numerous hitherto unpublished archive sources, now offers a captivating and original interpretation of the creator of Guernica. Un étranger nommé Picasso (Picasso. A Foreigner's Life) (Prix Femina Essai 2021) is a feverish and impassioned tale that leads right up to the present, evoking our most pressing concerns: "Doesn't the scandal that sees the greatest artist of the 20th century branded as a foreigner", writes the author, "recall the current resurgence of classic xenophobia?" Curator of the two exhibitions Picasso at Palazzo Te. Poetry and Salvation and Picasso the Foreigner at Palazzo Reale, Cohen-Solal will be speaking with writer Niccolo Ammaniti, author of a short piece inspired by the book. The event will be conducted by Michele Fusilli.

Points, levels, challenges and rewards, mechanisms typical of games and video games, are increasingly found in non-gaming contexts such as work, education, fitness and marketing. The purpose of this so-called gamification is to incentivise certain desired behaviours in people, through the kind of gratification we've all experienced on getting to the next level of Candy Crush. In You've Been Played, British writer and game designer Adrian Hon explains how gamification techniques are increasingly used by corporations and governments as control mechanisms, to the detriment of individual well-being. In dialogue with Cesare Alemanni, Hon will alert us to the pervasiveness of these mechanisms.

For many years, scientists have all agreed that human activities are causing global warming. However, it's also clear that sharing data, statistics and forecasts in a way that causes panic isn't the best way to raise awareness. Books can be a strong way to tell stories and persuade people, but how do we create an engaging environmental library that truly engages readers? Through the LAB project - (libri acque boschi), Festivaletteratura is working to build an eco-library that reaches out to everyone and inspires interest in environmental issues. The young people choosing the books for this annotated bibliography will be interviewing writers and scientists at the Festival to learn how to shape the eco-library, how to communicate its message, and how to connect it effectively with potential readers. David Quammen, a writer and science communicator known for his books Spillover and Breathless, will be looking at how to create this eco-library. During the event, through dialogue and readings, the author of Love Poems will share some of her most popular poems, highlighting the themes that characterise her work: love, loss, identity and the human condition, providing the audience with an insight into her creative process. 43 STORIES HOLD THE WORLD TOGETHER

Colum McCann with Francesca Mannocchi

James Wright Foley was an American journalist whose tragic story gained international attention in the previous decade. Kidnapped in Syria in 2012, he was brutally killed by ISIS terrorists after being held captive for two years. During his appearance at Festivaletteratura in 2021, author Colum McCann (Apeirogon, TransAtlantic, This Side of Brightness) revealed his wish to explore Foley's tragic destiny. Known for his exceptional ability to effortlessly merge fiction and fact, McCann, a native of Dublin and resident of New York City, skilfully weaves historical events into his narratives, which span from Northern Ireland to the United States and the Middle East. With the cooperation of Foley's mother, Diane, McCann has pieced together a harrowing account of Foley's time as a hostage, shedding light on the failures of the FBI, government indifference, and the accounts of survivors. In an attempt to understand how to talk about this unstable era in a novel, the author of American Mother will be joined on the Festivaletteratura stage by journalist Francesca Mannocchi.

53 THE DIRECTIONS OF EXILE

Hisham Matar with Paolo Giordano

With his novel The Return, Libyan-born writer Hisham Matar won the Pulitzer Prize for biography and autobiography in 2017, describing his return home from exile in search of his father. Seven years have passed since then, and the author returns to reflect on events in Libya with his recent My Friends, a work in which the characters he created invert their direction, moving from Tripoli to England, and interact with real historical events. "This is a book I have been thinking about since the Arab Spring of 2011. Or so I thought until I found a note written on the back of an envelope from 2003, where I had jotted down the idea for a novel about friends in exile and that country of the soul that only certain deep friendships can create". Matar will be talking with writer Paolo Giordano about the issue of ties far from the homeland and why this new book is so close to his heart.

"My book has a jazzy rhythm, a 5/4... it starts off slowly, but you can feel a storm coming," as former drummer Joel Dicker recently explained to Geppi Cucciari about his latest work Un Animal Sauvage (A Wild Animal). Fans of thriller and crime novels will no doubt have found themselves eagerly flipping through the Swiss novelist's works in recent years, trying to get to the bottom of their mysteries. On the other hand, if each of the Geneva author's books (The Enigma of Room 622, The Disappearance of Stephanie Mailer, The Alaska Sanders Affair, The Truth about Harry Quebert) become instant bestsellers, it's not just because Dicker skilfully mixes puzzles with time jumps in his stories. It's also because he clearly loves solving mysteries: "I've always been passionate about investigating, exploring things that aren't obvious at first. I'm a curious person, always wanting to learn more about human beings and their fears." He will be discussing this with writer and mystery novelist Alessia Gazzola.

The aim is to gather information on the state of health of a river ecosystem, creating a video that documents the soul and identity of a forest, and developing a library that engages with children and young adults on topics about the environment. LAB works closely with schools, research organisations, and local libraries to help young people learn about and appreciate the ecosystems around them, fostering a deeper understanding of environmental issues.

Coordinating LAB activities are Irene Fabbri, Marco Faggioli and Cecilia Fasciani.

ECO-LIBRARY

Festivaletteratura is working to build an eco-library that reaches out to the young and very young and inspires interest in environmental issues. The library will be used in schools, public libraries and for individual reading. The boys and girls involved in the project will discuss with experts and science communicators attending the Festival how to make this library accessible to all.





While Socrates' famous quote, "I know that I do not know," reflects our desire for learning and understanding, there's also the saying "ignorance is bliss." So, how do we find the right balance? Despite the hopes that came with the Enlightenment and advancements in science, it seems that rather than gaining knowledge, we are losing it, replacing what we once understood with new and virtually infinite notions. British historian Peter Burke argues that the huge increase in information over recent years doesn't match our ability to truly learn from it, as we can't keep up with the sheer volume of data. 





One of the most highly respected authors in the Spanish language Formas de volver a casa (Ways of Going Home), Mis documentos (My Documents), he has explored Chile's shift to democracy in the 1990s, focusing on themes like the challenges of masculinity, generational conflicts, and the struggles in relationships between fathers and children. In his latest work, Literatura infantile, he takes a more personal approach, reflecting on his own experiences as a parent. He observes how, just like members of the audience who miss the start of a film, our children often bring back forgotten memories of our own childhood. He is joined on stage by Simonetta Bitasi.

214 AN EXERCISE IN REVOLT

Sorj Chalandon with Carlo Lucarelli

One of the peculiarities of Sorj Chalandon's fiction is the urgency to rebel against inexorable states of affairs, be they painful losses such as the one that afflicts the main character in *Le Jour D'Avant*, or a medical report that prompts the bookseller in *Une Joie Féroce* to open up to life and friendship. His latest book, *L'Enragé*, is based on the real-life escape of fifty children from a prison colony on the island of Belle-lle-en-Mer, off the coast of Brittany, in 1934. Although most of the children were caught quickly, one child was never found. What happened to him? Where was his voice? The conversation between Carlo Lucarelli and one of the most talented European novelists of recent years opens around these questions - and the need for literature as an exercise in revolt.

"Don't get bogged down with precise descriptions (...) Africa is big: fifty-four countries, 900 million people who are too busy starving and dying and warring and emigrating to read your book. (...) keep your descriptions romantic and evocative and unparticular." This was just one of the caustic tips that, almost twenty years ago, the late Binyavanga Wainaina gave in his famous article *How to Write About Africa*. Against Wainaina's advice, Nigerian journalist Dipo Faloyin addresses the complexity of the continent in his book *Africa is Not a Country*, celebrating the many identities of Africa today. He talks about fundamental issues like colonialism, geopolitics, and how Africa is portrayed in the media, while also sharing his own experiences. Faloyin sets out to challenge the simplistic Western view that treats Africa as one single, exotic place filled with stereotypes. He will be joined on stage by journalist Veronica Fernandes. The author will speak in English, with consecutive interpretation into Italian.



Jessa Crispin with Giulia Perona 15:00 PALAZZO SAN SEBASTIANO 7,50€

The American Midwest is known for its strong conservative beliefs, especially in politics and religion. Family, school, and the churches scattered across the territory are incubators for the most extreme expressions of the patriarchal system. Jessa Crispin (*Why I Am Not a Feminist*), born in Kansas, has thought a lot about how the prevailing culture shapes society to the detriment of women, not just on the Great Plains but everywhere. Drawing from her own experiences, she highlights how discussions around gender-based violence can be misleading, often involving blame directed at victims and the idea that "not all men" are part of the problem. The author of *My Three Dads* emphasises the need for a real shift in how society operates, suggesting that simply putting women into positions of power isn't enough if the underlying issues remain the same. She argues that having wealthy or powerful women who act in harmful ways does not change the overall situation. It's easy to talk about empowering women, but if they are fascists or if they work in companies that destroy the world and do not take care of society, then everything remains haunted by the spectres of patriarchy. She will be joined by Giulia Perona (*Senza rossetto*).


If you rent a bike in busy Amsterdam and ride for just half an hour, you can find yourself in picturesque countryside filled with charming old houses, peaceful canals, and vibrant flower gardens. "In a way, I need these things in my books, these landscapes, because I want to focus on the details, on the real things, and in a big city one can easily miss them. Speaking figuratively, I want to get rid of the noise," says former gardener Gerbrand Bakker, who spent his childhood on a farm and knows the northern part of the Netherlands well. Bakker is one of Holland's most influential contemporary writers, known for *Boven is het stil (The Twin), June*, and *The Detour*. 

In a world where fake news attacks democracy every day, to protect freedom of expression it is not only necessary to beware of corrupt governments, but also "of big tech, which has seized the reins of the world, for better or worse". "It's as if a virus of lies has been released into the information ecosystem; it infects people, changing what they think and how they act," says Maria Ressa (*How to Stand Up to a Dictator*), Nobel Peace Prize winner in 2021. The Filipino-born journalist has been fighting for years against those who want to silence investigative journalists and distort the truth, and she has faced persecution from former president Rodrigo Duterte for her efforts. Alongside journalist Veronica Fernandes, Maria Ressa will discuss how algorithms and business interests often hold more influence than democratic values.

Additionally, children will have the opportunity to explore a menagerie amid the frescoed rooms of Palazzo Te, accompanied by Eloisa Morra, Francesca Scotti, and Massimiliano Tappari, as part of a workshop aimed at creating a new bestiary for Mantova.
















GETTING AROUND

Getting to Mantova and moving about in town

In 2021 we made a pledge to limit the Festival's carbon footprint, reducing greenhouse gas emissions to a minimum for both our own and the public's transport. Here we provide you with all the information you need to plan your trip sustainably.

→ TRAINS 🔒



Direct rail connections to Mantova: MI-LAN, VERONA, MODENA, BOLOGNA, CREMONA. The station is just a few minutes' walk from the old town. Due to improvements on the Mantova-Milan line, a replacement bus runs in either direction between Mantova and Bozzolo.

→ BUSES 🖃



Several bus services connect the old town with other places in the province, outside the province and with the different



neighbourhoods of the city. The LINEA CC is a circular bus route that takes you right round the old town, with departures every 15 minutes. Full details of all APAM city and intercity bus services are available online (www.apam.it) or by scanning this QR Code.

→ VISITORS WITH LIMITED MOBILITY

ANFFAS offers a dedicated service with purpose-trained staff and anti-covid measures. Departures from Campo Canoa and Piazza Virgiliana car parks. There is no charge for this service, but reservations must be made by Tuesday 3 September.

There are 4 park-and-ride car parks located at entry points to the city: Campo Canoa, Piazzale Montelungo and Cimitero degli Angeli (free of charge) and the Porta Pradella underground car park (pay and display). From Campo Canoa and Piazzale Montelungo Apam operates a free shuttle service into town departing every 12 minutes from 7:00 to 24:00 on Festival days. Other car parks in town: Anconetta, Porta Mulina, Piazza Virgiliana, Piazzale Gramsci, viale Risorgimento, viale Isonzo, viale Mincio (pay and display zones).

→ CYCLING &

Mantova is a mostly flat, bike-friendly town with a historic centre largely closed to traffic and good cycling infrastructure. Cycling is undoubtedly the most convenient and fastest way of getting around town. To encourage its use even over longer distances (in

urban routes between 5 and 10 km, the bicycle is faster than the car in terms of overall travel time and parking), we've created a map with safe cycle routes to the centre both from the neighbouring municipalities (Curtatone, Borgo Virgilio San Giorgio Bigarello and Porto Mantovano) and from the 4 park-and-ride car parks. The recommended routes follow cycle paths and pedestrian areas or low-traffic roads.

Now declared of notable cultural interest by Lombardy Region's Superintending Body for Archives, the Festivaletteratura Archive was created in 2010, to preserve the material collected by the Comitato Organizzatore di Festivaletter-

atura (now Associazione Mantova Festival Internazionali NPO) and by the Associazione Filofestival (Friends of Festivaletteratura).

As reorganisation and cataloguing continue, the Archive remains open by appointment: visitors might simply want to re-experience a vividly remembered event, or to use the wealth of available material as the basis for new projects.

In 2019 we celebrated our first ten years of activity with a new portal, born as a joint venture between the Festivaletteratura Archive and Promemoria Group. Promemoria made this possible thanks to a bespoke update of its Archiui.com platform, with innovative graphics and enhanced functional features. Its faster, more intuitive search function lets you start exploring as soon as you're on the home page, where you can look up past editions, guests, venues and all events from 1997 to date. We also added a special area for our press reviews and featured topics, as well as a news and information section. The sound section of the Archive now contains over 2,700 audio recordings, spanning the various editions of the Festival, and a vast array of topics can be accessed online and enjoyed one by one. And you can expect a treasure trove of further surprises as the cataloguing continues - videos, photos, graphic art and related material, all providing a vivid record of an adventure that's still going strong after almost thirty years.
